Location: Campbell River

The Kwakiutl District Council ("KDC") is a not-for-profit society whose clients consist of 10 First Nations located primarily in the northeast region of Vancouver Island representing an on-reserve population of approximately 3500 living in remote, rural and urban environments. The KDC provides government funded programs and services with an annual budget of +/- \$2.5 million and 40+ staff.

Mental Health & Addictions ("MHA") Program Manager

Reporting to the Health Director, MHA Program Manager:

- Provides day to day leadership of the MHA function including supervision of +/-10 member team.
- Acts in a clinical supervisory role, taking overall responsibility for progress of cases, staff mentorship as well as for regulatory compliance of operations and client files with legal and confidentiality requirements etc.
- Acts as certified counselor, providing clients with a full range of intake and counseling services including addictions, crisis intervention, individual, family and children.
- Spearheads agency-wide mental health initiatives and strategic partnerships.
- Offers ideas for improved infrastructure e.g. operating frameworks, policy, procedures and evaluation methods.
- Schedules and manages needs assessments, workplans, programming activities, timeframes and local program budget.

Qualifications:

- Masters level degree in an allied discipline, including supervised practicum.
- Registered member in good standing with a regulatory body e.g.CCA or BCACC.
- 8 years as certified counselor including 1 year in a community setting.
- 3+ years in a management position.
- Familiarity with clinical supervision and generally-accepted practices required.
- Computer and spreadsheet expertise, proposal writing and presentation skills.

On-Call Casual Community Health & Home Care Nurse

Reporting to the Health Director, this on-call position is a professionally accredited nurse who works as part of a casual labour pool, accepting daily or weekly fill in assignments for full-time nurses who are on sick leave, vacation, etc. Classified as casual, this position has no guaranteed hours, accepting daily or weekly assignments on as needed basis. Incumbent is certified to provide a full complement of community nursing and home care to clients and assists with special projects or programming if required.

Qualifications:

- Current registration and in good standing with CRNBC
- Bachelor of Science in Nursing Degree.
- Current CDC certification required.
- Current CPR certification.
- 1 year as a practicing CHN/HCN preferably in a community setting.
- Computer experience including EMR/ electronic charting is preferred.

Both positions must have the ability to work flexible hours including evenings and weekends as required. In addition both required:

- Possession of a valid B.C. driver's license and reliable vehicle.
- Vulnerable criminal records check and driver's abstract.
- Ability to travel to northern island locations and stay overnight as needed.
- Salaries as per KDC Pay Equity Program.
- Previous experience working in a First Nations Community is preferred.
